Obtaining a Secondary Application

It takes 4-6 weeks for your primary application to be processed by AACOMAS. In the meantime, you may download the [supplemental application](#) from our website, complete it and send it back to the Admissions Office.

Completion of no less than 75% of the credits required for a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution.

- **Biology:** Minimum of 8 semester units
- **Organic Chemistry:** Minimum of 8 semester units (including lecture and lab)
- **Inorganic Chemistry:** Minimum of 8 semester units (including lecture and lab)
- **Physics:** Minimum of 8 semester units (including lecture and lab)
- **English:** Minimum of 6 semester units
- **MCAT** (can be no more than 3 years old)

Labs are required in all science prerequisites unless otherwise noted.

Final grades for all prerequisite courses must be verified before registration.
