## Important Points for Security:

- Security may be called when someone on campus is sick. The Security cell phone number has been published in campus-wide H1N1 materials. Security officers will be responsible for transporting sick individuals to the Department of Outpatient Services on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the DCOM building for testing and treatment.
  - Call a doctor immediately if a student has trouble breathing, pain in the chest or abdomen, sudden dizziness or confusion.
- All Security vehicles will be provided with surgical masks, gloves and sanitizer. Keep a supply of these in each car at all times. If you are running low on supplies, send an email to amy.drittler@lmunet.edu to request more.
- When you pick up a sick individual, you must wear a surgical mask and gloves. Put these on before approaching the person. Keep these on the entire time you are in the presence of your passenger.
- Give your passenger a surgical mask to wear during the transport. This should be put on before the person gets into the car, and should remain on through their visit to the Department of Outpatient Services.
- Have the person ride in the back of your vehicle to promote a safe distance between you and your passenger.
- After the transport is finished, you must disinfect your vehicle with the sanitizer. Wipe down the door handles (both interior and exterior), the seats, window controls and anything else in the car that may have been touched by your passenger.
- Be a good role model:
  - Wash your hands frequently.
  - **Cover Your Cough!**
  - If you have flu-like symptoms, isolate yourself for 7 days after a positive lab diagnosis or for 24 hours after symptoms disappear – whichever is longer.
