About the Program

The initiation of the Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) degree at LMU in 1974 was due to the increasing health care needs of the people in Harrogate, Tenn., and the surrounding areas. Since its conception, the ASN program has grown from one location and one admission date to multiple locations and multiple admission dates, affording many the opportunity to begin a great career and work in their communities. This program is based on the belief that nursing is a service profession that will assist individuals to attain, maintain or regain an optimum level of wellness through the application of the nursing process. Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN) can continue their education by getting an ASN (LPN-ASN).

The Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) program will:

- prepare nurses who can care for individuals with common, recurrent, predictable health problems
- prepare graduates eligible to write the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN)
- provide a foundation for continued education in nursing

Accreditation

The associate degree program is approved by both the Tennessee Board of Nursing and the Kentucky Board of Nursing. Furthermore, the associate undergraduate degree is accredited by the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission (NLNAC), Inc.

Admission Process

Admission to the ASN program is competitive.

Admission criteria includes:

- admission to LMU
- formal application for admission to the program
- academic transcripts from all postsecondary schools attended
- number of repeated courses and withdrawals
- grade improvement over a period of time

Acceptance into the nursing program requires:

- health care provider CPR certification
- physical exam
- evidence of current negative chest x-ray or PPD tuberculin skin test; Rubella, Rubeola & Mumps titer or documentation of two MMR vaccines
- Varicella titer, positive history of chicken pox or immunization with Varicella vaccine
- Hepatitis B immunization series or signed declination form
- negative chain of custody urine drug screen
- completed and signed Student Essential Functions form
