About the BSN Program, BSN Option

LMU's Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) commenced the BSN Option in August 2010. This unique, accelerated 17-month program is offered in Knoxville, Tennessee, at LMU's Cedar Bluff site. The BSN Option provides students the opportunity to obtain their nursing education in four sequential semesters, enabling them to enter the workforce a minimum of six months earlier than traditional programs. By serving a tri-state region in Appalachia, the Caylor School of Nursing will fulfill its mission to provide highly qualified professional nurses to meet the health care needs and disparities of surrounding communities. The BSN degree requires 68 general education hours and 60 upper division nursing hours.

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Option will:

- prepare the baccalaureate nurse as a generalist, caring for individuals, families, community groups, and society at any point on the wellness-illness continuum
- prepare graduates eligible to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN)
- provide a foundation for continued education in nursing

Admission

Admission criteria for the BSN Option include:

- admission to LMU
- formal application for admission to the BSN program
- satisfactory completion of general education and program course requirements
- academic transcripts from all postsecondary schools attended
- cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher
- completed medical profile form and evidence of a negative chain of custody urine drug screen
- completed and signed Student Essential Functions Form

Approval/Accreditation

The baccalaureate undergraduate degree program is approved by the Tennessee Board of Nursing. Furthermore, the baccalaureate undergraduate degree program is accredited by the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission (NLNAC), Inc.

NOTE: Please be aware that in certain academic programs (such as the ASN and BSN Nursing Programs) requiring internship or placement, a criminal background check, and an additional chain of custody urine drug screen (in addition to the one required with the medical profile), may be required by affiliate agencies and organizations. If required, these tests would be at the student's expense.
