

**FALL 2019 FIRST YEAR, PART-TIME FLEX PROGRAM SCHEDULE**

The part-time *flex* program is designed to complete the program of legal education in no more than seven years.

Ideally, students would complete the program in five or six years.

Part-time flex program participants are required to meet with the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs *before registration each semester* to ensure proper and sequential scheduling of classes.

Students in the **part-time flex program** will be enrolled in multiple sections of all classes. The Office of Academic Affairs will register you for your classes and sections. Sections B & C of the three skills classes (Legal Foundations I, Legal Communication I, and Legal Research I) will be enrolled in Section A of Civil Procedure I. Section D of the skills classes will be enrolled in Section B of Civil Procedure I. Section A of the skills classes will be split between the doctrinal sections. Part-time *flex* students will not be enrolled in Section E of the skills classes.

In compliance with ABA Standard 311(b), “A law school shall require that the course of study for the J.D. degree be completed no earlier than 24 months and, except in extraordinary circumstances, no later than 84 months after a student has commenced law study at the law school or a law school from which the school has accepted transfer credit.” Additionally, ABA Standard 311(c) requires, “A law school shall not permit a student to be enrolled at any time in coursework that exceeds 20 percent of the total credit hours required by that school for graduation.”
