RN-BSN Curriculum Plan

To be eligible for the RN-BSN program, the applicant must:

1. Be enrolled in or have completed an accredited associate degree program in nursing
2. Show proof of a valid non-restricted RN license (if student is a new graduate the RN license must be received no later than the fourth week of beginning the semester)
3. Have an overall GPA of 2.75 or higher on all college-level course work.
4. Apply for admission to the University.
5. Apply for admission to the Caylor School of Nursing

NOTE: Students who hold a current registered nurse license making application to the RN-BSN Program could receive up to 31 upper-level credit hours for proficiency validated by licensure. To receive credit hours for knowledge validated by licensure the registered nurse must:

- Hold a current unrestricted registered nurse license in the state in which the student resides.
- Have been active in clinical practice for one year **or** have graduated from a nursing program within the last year.
- Have earned a grade of "C" or better in previous nursing courses.
- Completed 16 credit hours in the RN-BSN Program in the Caylor School of Nursing
