CURRICULAR OFFERINGS

The four year (eight semester) curriculum is based on the philosophy of "clinical immersion" that recognizes medical knowledge must be developed alongside clinical and professional skills.

Pre-clinical sciences are taught on the Harrogate and DVTC campuses during semesters one through six. Courses are delivered via a modified approach to the study of body systems, in which anatomy and physiology are presented concurrently. This allows the student to develop comprehensive and practical understanding of the body's systems and begins to train the mind in the discipline of clinical reasoning that is essential for clinical experiences that will occur in semesters seven and eight.

During the final two semesters (clinical year) students learn and actively participate at a wide variety of collaborative clinical sites to actively utilize their pre-clinical education in a "real world" setting. Students take required rotations in surgery and medicine during this year and are presented with the opportunity to self-direct their own education via electives and externships at approved sited of their choosing.

GOALS

The primary goal of the College of Veterinary Medicine (CVM) is to educate competent and compassionate veterinarians in an accredited, four-year hybrid professional curriculum with educational experiences both in on-campus teaching facilities and at off-campus community-based clinical sites. The second goal of the CVM is recruitment and retention of a diverse and interactive faculty, staff and student body, committed to values-based service to animals and people. The third goal of the CVM is One Health advancement of service to people, animals and the environment through values-based veterinary education and collaborative research programs.

SELECTION CRITERIA

The LMU-CVM strives to provide opportunities for gualified individuals seeking entry into the veterinary profession. The Admissions Committee will select applicants based on a variety of factors. Holistic review points include but are not limited to academics. GPA trends, experience in the veterinary profession, extracurricular activities, applicant interview performance, and results from the CASPer assessment exam. We seek to enroll bright, hard-working students whose goal is to advance the science and art of veterinary medicine wherever they choose to enter professional practice.
