Required Letters of Recommendation

- One Pre-Medical Committee letter
or
- Two letters from science professors
and
- One Physician letter DO or MD

Prerequisites

Official MCAT scores cannot be more than three years old at the time of application.

Completion of no less than 75% of the credits required for a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution and successful completion of the following coursework with a grade of “C” or higher in each course:

- **Biology:** Minimum of 8 semester hours (including lecture and lab)
- **Inorganic Chemistry:** Minimum of 8 semester hours (including lecture and lab)
- **Organic Chemistry:** Minimum of 8 semester hours (including lecture and lab) Biochemistry may be substituted
- **Physics:** Minimum of 8 semester hours (including lecture and lab)
- **English:** Minimum of 6 semester hours

Labs are required in all science prerequisites unless otherwise noted.

Final grades for all prerequisite courses must be verified before registration as an LMU-DCOM student.
