

**FALL 2020 FIRST YEAR, FLEX-TIME PROGRAM SCHEDULE**

The flex-time program is a reduced-load curriculum designed for people who have outside commitments and who cannot or prefer not to attend school on a full-time basis.

Flex-time program participants must complete the program of legal education in no more than 84 months (seven years). Ideally, students would complete the program in four-to-six years. Flex-time program students are required to meet with or contact the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs *before registration each semester* to ensure proper scheduling/sequencing of classes.

Typically, flex-time students take six or nine hours each semester their first year and 12 credit hours each semester thereafter.

If you have a 3.000 LGPA after the spring semester of your first year, you can apply for the **Accelerated JD Program** and possibly graduate in three-and-a-half (3.5) years.

Flex-time program students will be enrolled in one of the Wednesday sections of Legal Communication and Legal Research unless you request to attend one or both of these classes on a different date. Minor changes may occur depending on our final enrollment numbers, especially for Legal Communication, Legal Research, and Legal Foundations.

The Office for Academic Affairs will register you for your classes and sections (if applicable) your first year. You will begin registering for your classes starting your second year.

In compliance with ABA Standard 311(b), “A law school shall require that the course of study for the J.D. degree be completed no earlier than 24 months and, except in extraordinary circumstances, no later than 84 months after a student has commenced law study at the law school or a law school from which the school has accepted transfer credit.” Additionally, ABA Standard 311(c) requires, “A law school shall not permit a student to be enrolled at any time in coursework that exceeds 20 percent of the total credit hours required by that school for graduation.”
