

SPRING 2021 FIRST YEAR, FLEX-TIME PROGRAM SCHEDULE

The flex-time program is a reduced-load curriculum designed for people who have outside commitments and who cannot or prefer not to attend school on a full-time basis. Flex-time program participants must complete the program of legal education in no more than seven years. Ideally, students would complete the program in four-to-six years. Flex-time program students are required to meet with the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs *before registration each semester* to ensure proper scheduling/sequencing of classes.

For students enrolled in the **flex-time program**, there are multiple sections for each class or subject. Typically, flex-time students take 6 or 9 hours each semester their first year and 12 credit hours each semester thereafter. The Office of Academic Affairs will register you for your classes and sections in the first year.

In compliance with ABA Standard 311(b), "A law school shall require that the course of study for the J.D. degree be completed no earlier than 24 months and, except in extraordinary circumstances, no later than 84 months after a student has commenced law study at the law school or a law school from which the school has accepted transfer credit." Additionally, ABA Standard 311(c) requires, "A law school shall not permit a student to be enrolled at any time in coursework that exceeds 20 percent of the total credit hours required by that school for graduation."
