

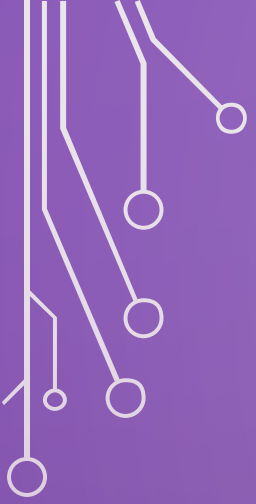

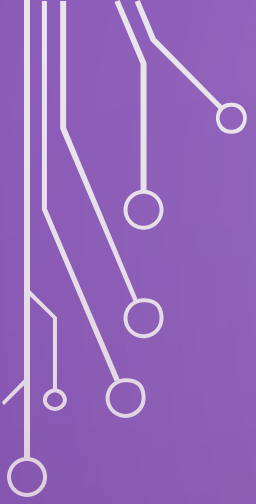

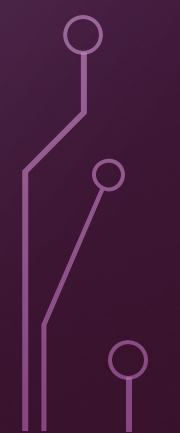


WHY
