
News from the School of Mathematics and Science

Dr. LaRoy Brandt, Associate Professor of Conservation Biology and Dr. Ashutosh Verma, Associate Professor of Microbiology, along with numerous students and other faculty and staff have published a research article titled, *Detection of pathogenic Leptospira spp. in herpetofauna in Central Appalachia* in the journal Zoonoses and Public Health.

This work represents an ongoing research collaboration between the School of Math & Science, the Department of Biology, the Cumberland Mountain Research Center, and the LMU College of Veterinary Medicine. Overall, this is the second article in which we are investigating the prevalence of leptospirosis within Central Appalachia. Our previous work focused on leptospirosis in rodents and other small mammals in our area, while this project focused on leptospirosis in the amphibians and reptiles of our region. Leptospirosis is a bacterial disease that is known to infect vertebrates, including humans. Our work is an effort to

establish an environmental baseline of this disease in order to understand the overall epidemiology of leptospirosis. Most notably, this publication not only represents a collaboration between various LMU faculty and staff, but also multiple veterinary students and undergraduates.



Dr. Brandt also recently published an outreach audio book as a podcast on the science communication channel, SciPod. Brandt is very pleased to share this highlight from the conservation biology research conducted through the CMRC at LMU.


