After working in the radio and television news for several years, he returned to academia to pursue a graduate degree. Dr. Gee obtained a Master of Science from the University of Tennessee concentrating in Journalism & Electronic Media. He would earn a Ph.D. in the College of Communication & Information Science at the University of Tennessee focusing on the role of backpack journalism on story quality in news presentations. After graduation, Gee applied his craft an assistant professor in the Journalism & Media Arts department at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh. Seeking warmer climate, he settled at Lincoln Memorial University. Gee was awarded a Fulbright Scholarship to teach journalism in the University of Zagreb School of Political Science in Croatia.

Dr. Gee research interests surround the world of storytelling. He explores how the role of technology may influence journalistic presentations, legal responsibility of reality television play in adhering to privacy law, and pedagogical techniques applied to journalism and media ethics courses.
