Biography

Dr. Hoskins currently serves as an Assistant Professor of Social Work and Field Coordinator at LMU. She has taught graduate-level social work courses at other universities and served as an adjunct instructor at multiple institutions. Dr. Hoskins received her bachelor's degree in social work from Union Commonwealth University, Barbourville, KY. She earned a master's degree in social work from Campbellsville University, Campbellsville, KY, and her doctorate degree from Simmons University, Boston, Massachusetts. Dr. Hoskins holds a Licensed Master Social Work (LMSW) license in Kentucky and is currently working toward licensure in Tennessee. Dr. Hoskins brings a strong practice-informed perspective to her teaching and has experience across higher education, child and adult protective services, medical social work, school-based social work, and geriatric social work. Her work emphasizes interdisciplinary collaboration, trauma-informed practice, and the preparation of competent, ethically grounded social work professionals. Dr. Hoskins has two sons, Collin and Braxton. Her hobbies include traveling, crocheting, sewing, and spending time with family and her dogs.

Teaching and Research Interests

Dr. Hoskins teaching and research interests include child welfare and protection, kinship and grandfamily caregiving, school social work, behavioral and developmental challenges in children, and trauma-informed practice. She is particularly interested in social work education, field instruction, and preparing students for practice in complex service systems. Her current scholarly work includes the development of a practical guide for grandparents raising grandchildren and ongoing research examining behavioral challenges among kindergarten students born during the COVID-19 pandemic.
