

### Four -Year Plan

### English (BA) Teacher Licensure (6-12)

The following is a suggested four-year plan of study for freshmen entering LMU during the 2020 -2021 academic year. This plan should be used in conjunction with the University catalog and in consultation with the faculty advisor. Transfer students should contact their advisor if they have questions regarding transfer credit. Courses listed on the four-year plan may be taken during other semesters, based on availability and course placement. This plan meets LMU's general education (Liberal Arts Common Core) requirements, major requirements and 300/400 level course requirements. Lincoln Memorial University reserves the right to adjust at any time its Initial Teacher Licensure Undergraduate Program requirements to comply with changes mandated by the State Board of Education. Note: In order to graduate in four years (eight regular semesters) the student must average passing 16/17 hours per semester. Courses with \* must have a grade of C- or better.
