

## Psychology General Track - Four -Year Plan

The following is a suggested four-year plan of study for freshmen entering LMU during the 2022-2023 academic year. This plan should be used in conjunction with the University catalog and in consultation with the faculty advisor. Transfer students should contact their advisor if they have questions regarding transfer credit. Courses listed on the four-year plan may be taken during other years, based on availability and course placement. This plan meets LMU's general education (Liberal Arts Common Core) requirements, major requirements and 300/400 level course requirements. Note: In order to graduate in four years (eight regular semesters) the student must average passing 15/16 hours per semester. Major courses must have a grade of C- or better.
