Thank you for considering Lincoln Memorial University and the Carter & Moyers School of Education's Educational Specialist degree program. At LMU, you will find a degree program designed to meet and accommodate the individual needs of all candidates.

The EdS degree program offers a Hybrid Model consisting of six campus-based classes and four online sessions; however, beginning in Fall 2024 and going forward, the Hybrid Model will consist of seven campus-based classes and three online sessions. Our Hybrid program is synchronous allowing faculty and students the opportunity to interact in real-time.

The Online Model offers 5 three-week modules within each course for Spring and Fall and 4 three-week modules within each course for Summer. Our Online program is asynchronous in the sense that students can learn on their own schedule within a certain timeframe.

Both modules provide our candidates with a pathway that will fit into their busy professional lives. You will be required each semester to simultaneously work on three (or four) different courses at the same time, depending on the semester.

Within this program packet are descriptions of the two models. One describes the face-to-face Hybrid Model cohort, and the other describes the Online Model cohort. Each model is fully outlined in the packet giving you the information to aid you in selecting the right option to meet your plans for future study.

The EL major is suitable for candidates already holding Leadership Licensure, out-of-state candidates, higher education personnel, and practitioners seeking improvement with best practices in organizational leadership, innovative strategic school improvement, organizational alignment, and data collection analysis to improve the overall school community.

• Instructional Leadership (IL): <u>LEADING</u> to Initial Tennessee Leadership Licensure
The IL major is suitable for candidates with the state-required teaching experience
seeking to obtain Leadership Licensure. Additionally, the candidate will develop the

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necessary leadership skills in an education environment, focusing on leading and developing teachers at either the building or district level. This focus provides the tools to increase teachers' effectiveness, instructional strategies, and student assessment.
