This plan meets LMU's general education (Liberal Arts Common Core) requirements, major requirements and 300/400 level course requirements. *Lincoln Memorial University reserves the right to adjust at any time its Initial Teacher Licensure Undergraduate Program requirements to comply with changes mandated by the State Board of Education.* Note: In order to graduate in four years (eight regular semesters) the student must average passing 16/17 hours per semester.
