

# Doctor of Education / Thirty-Six Hour Program of Studies<sup>1</sup> Curriculum and Instruction Concentration

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The following presents a typical strategy for completing the requirements within Lincoln Memorial University's (LMU's) **Thirty-Six Hour Doctoral Program of Studies**<sup>2</sup> which is designed for those candidates entering the program with an Educational Specialist (EdS) degree **from Lincoln Memorial University** in the concentration of Curriculum and Instruction. This plan should be used in conjunction with *LMU's Graduate Catalog* and with advice from the candidate's Major Professor. As the EdS hours that are being accepted for transfer will have been taken in a given concentration (IL or CI), doctoral degree work must be in this same area of study. This plan reflects required core, research, and primary concentration coursework. Any candidate interested in two concentrations rather than one can select the 48-hour program (see footnotes).

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> The program of studies includes 9 hours of core coursework; 12 hours in a given concentration; and a minimum of 15 hours of research related to completion of the candidate's dissertation

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> IF these hours are required for financial aid eligibility and/or map against planned date for degree completion; otherwise, schedule these hours judiciously

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>6</sup> Those candidates who would like to pursue two concentrations in their program of study would add five (5) additional courses from another area of study resulting in a total of 48 credit hours. EDLC 899 credit hours will vary at the discretion of the candidate.
